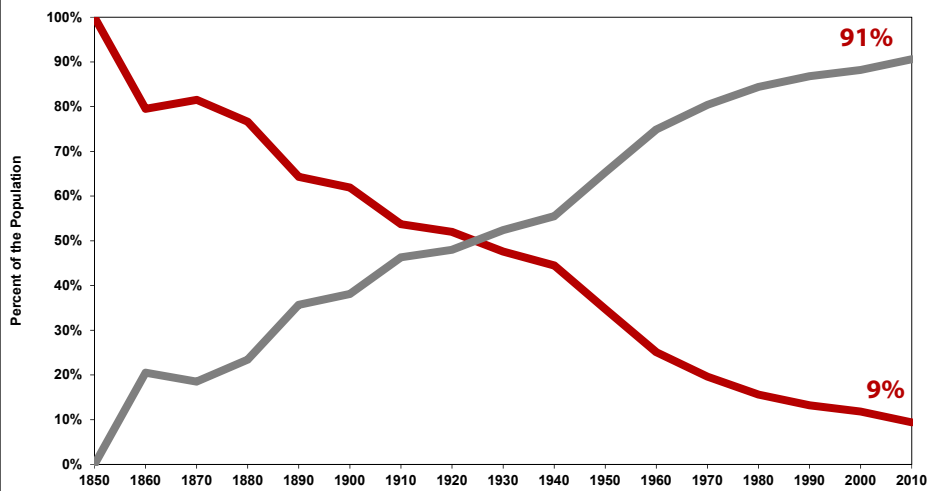

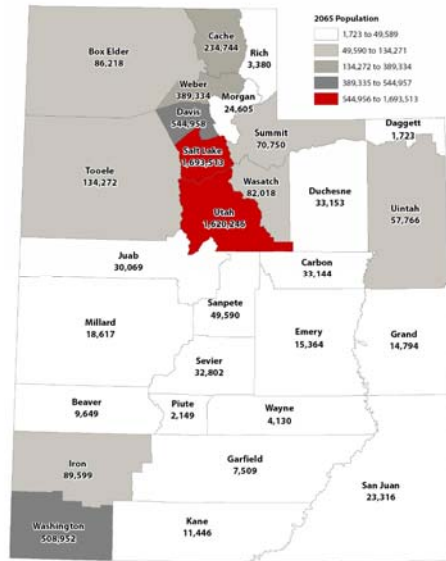

Urban Growth: Utah is an Urban State with Urban Issues

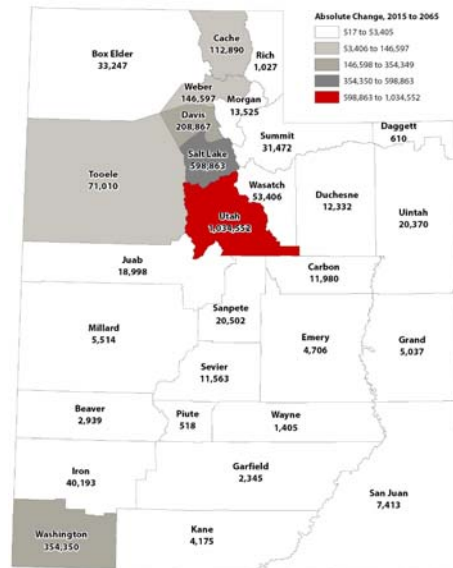


Total Population by County: 2065



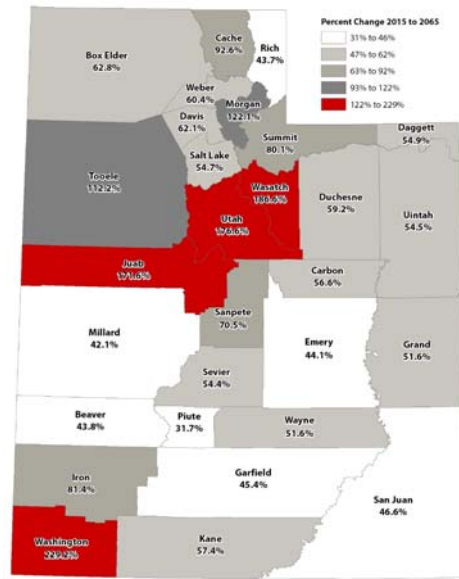

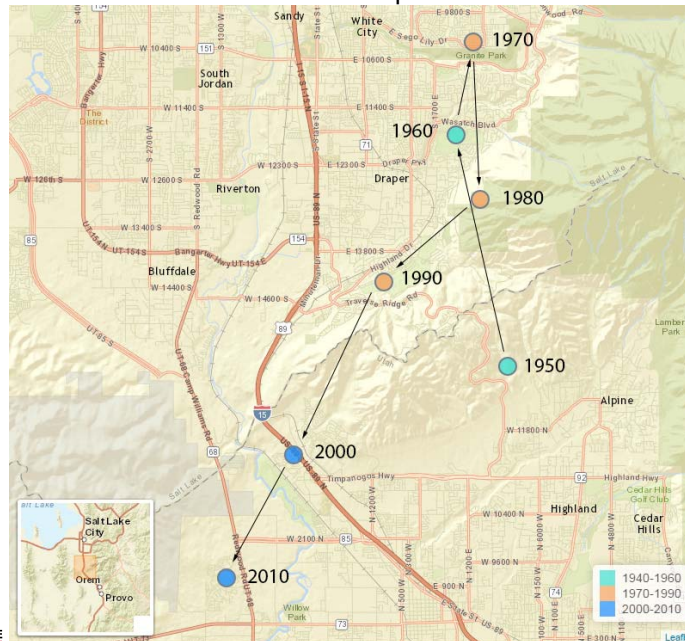
Percent Population Change by County: 2015-2065

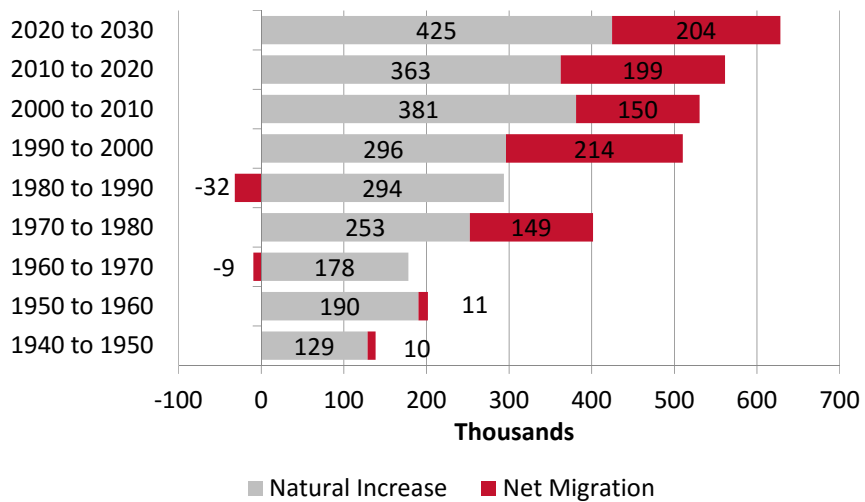

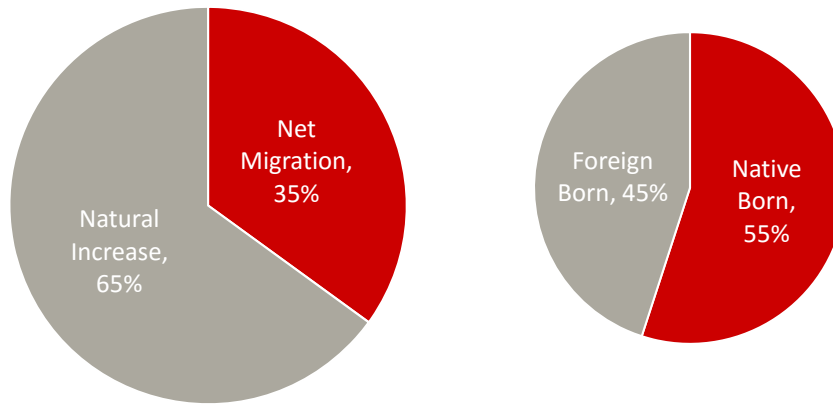

Utah 10-Year Components of Population Change



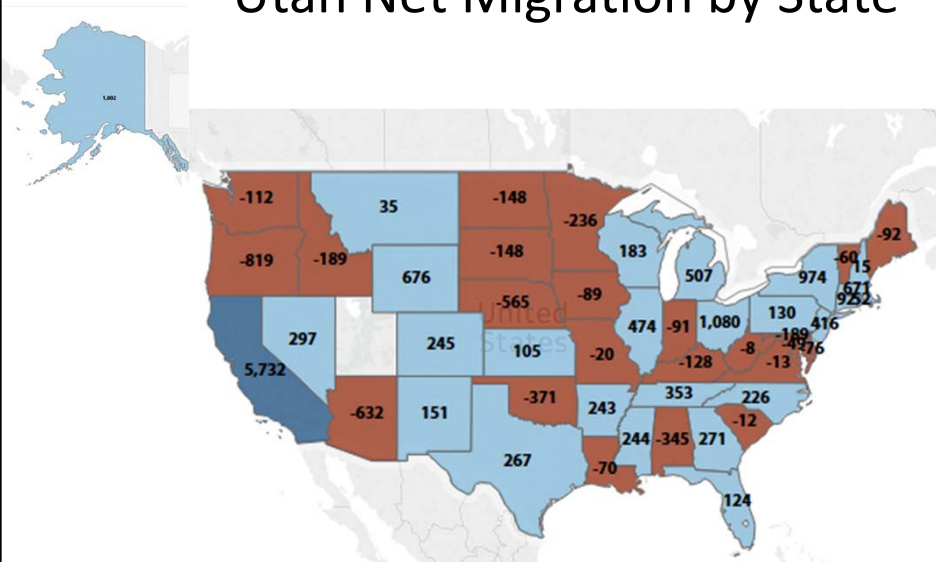

Utah Population Change 1990-2010

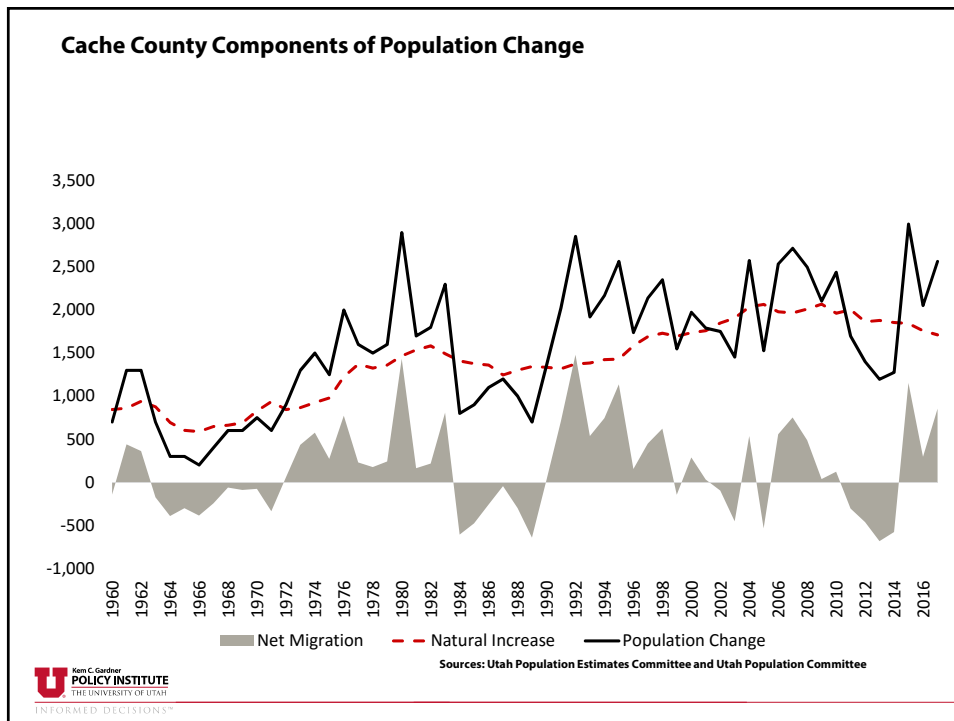
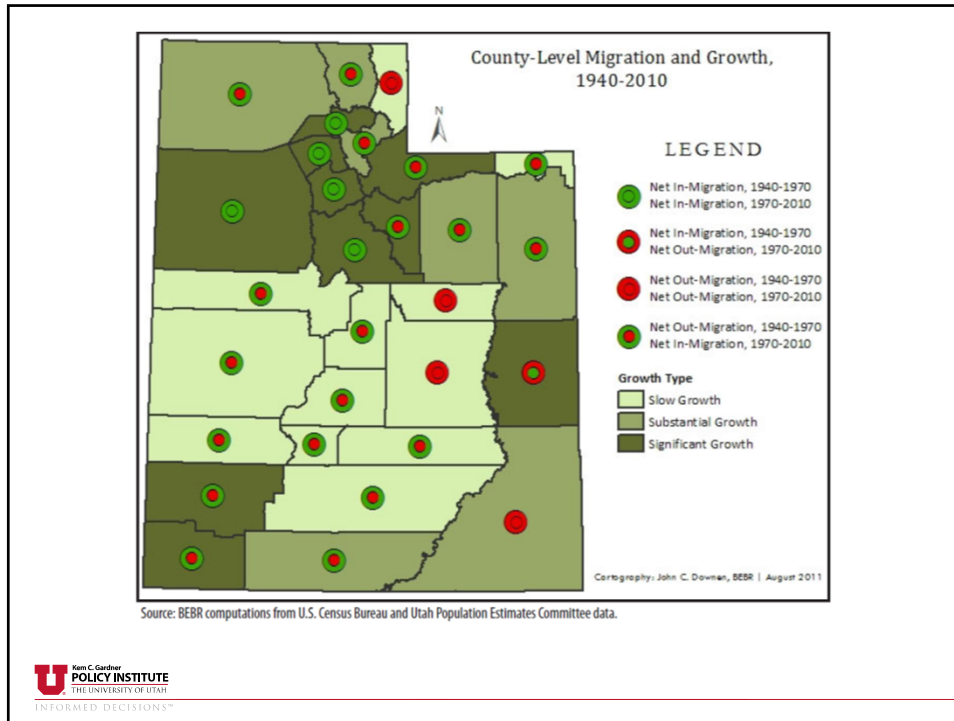


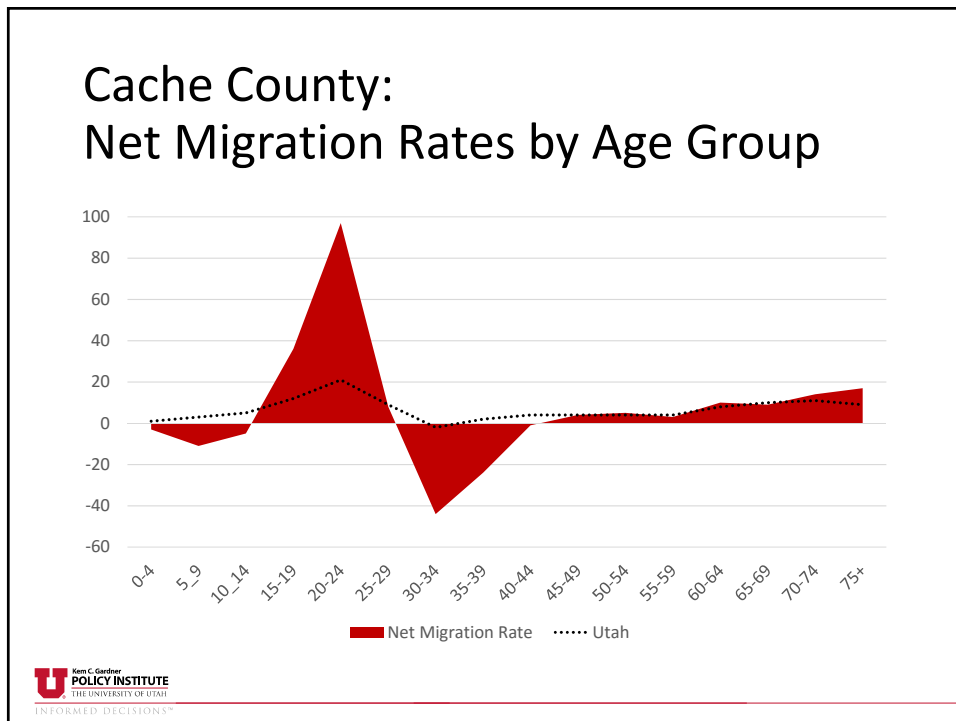
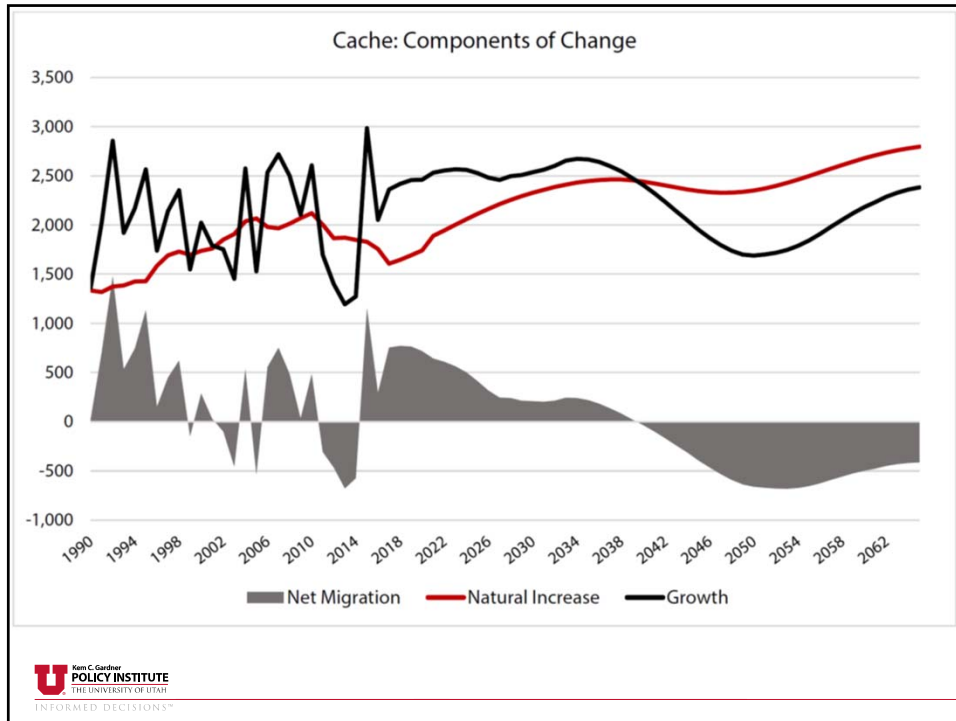

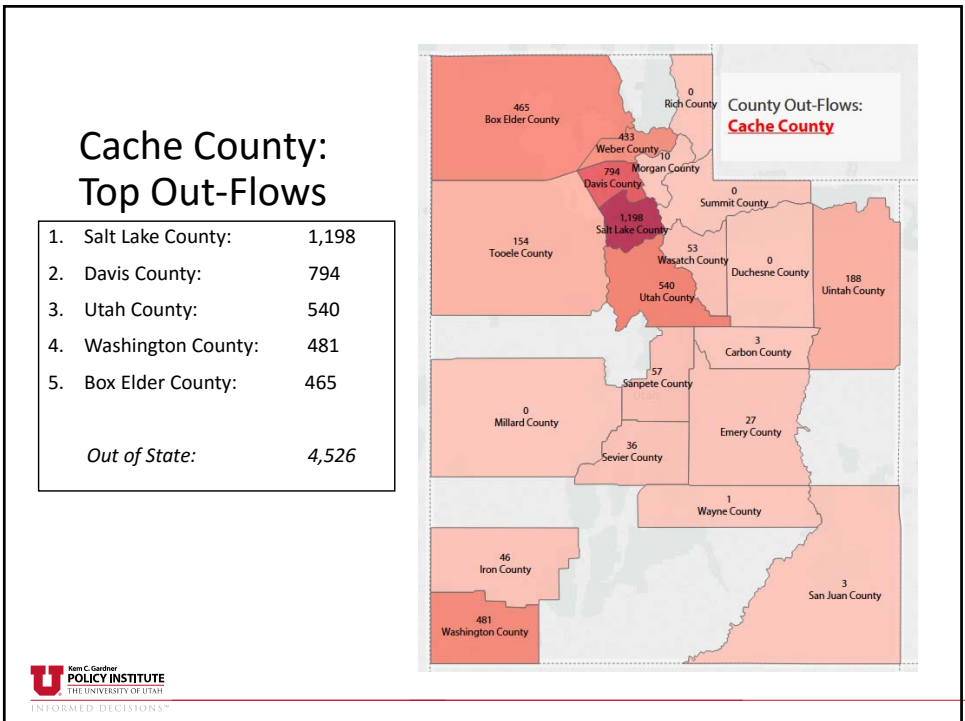
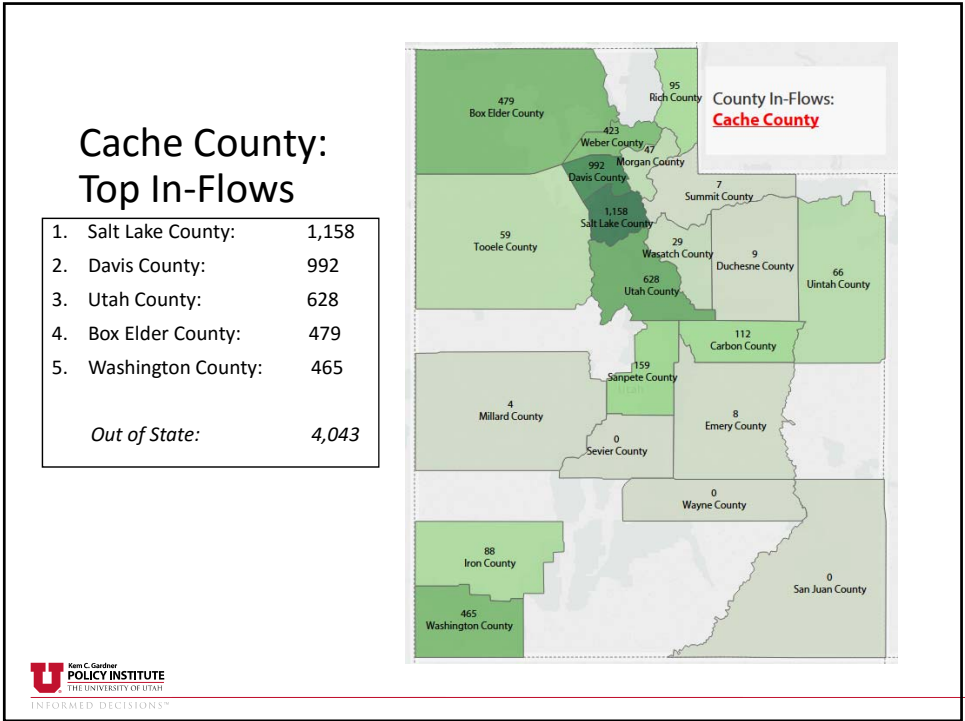
Utah Net Migration by State

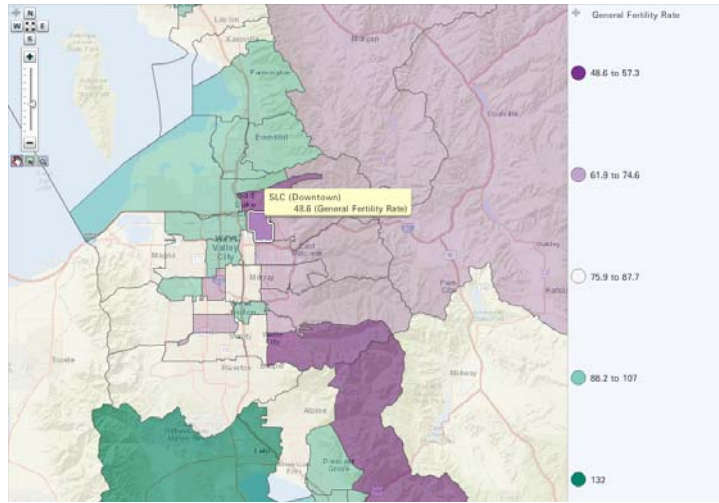

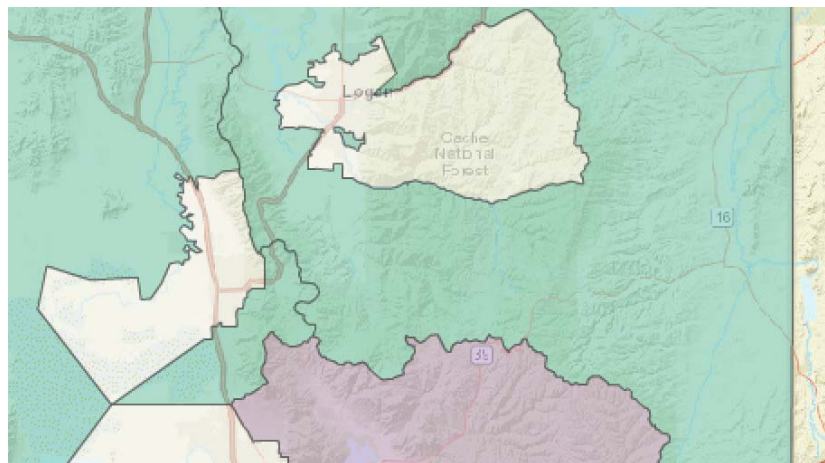
General Fertility Rate

Downtown Salt Lake City = 48.6



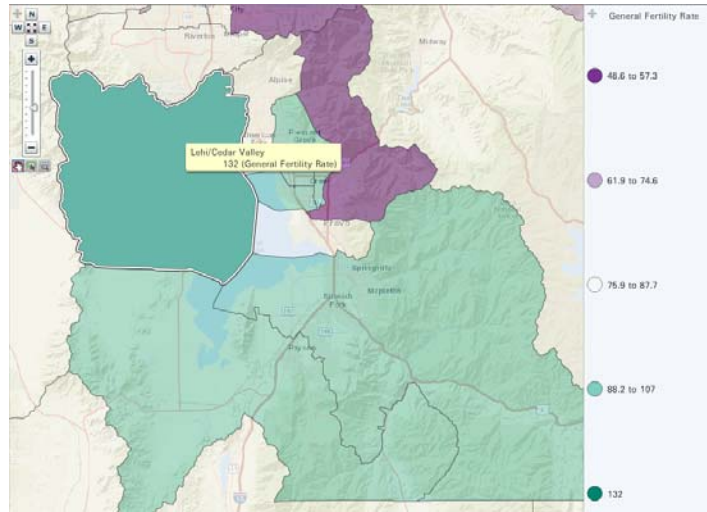
General Fertility Rate

Logan = 84.2



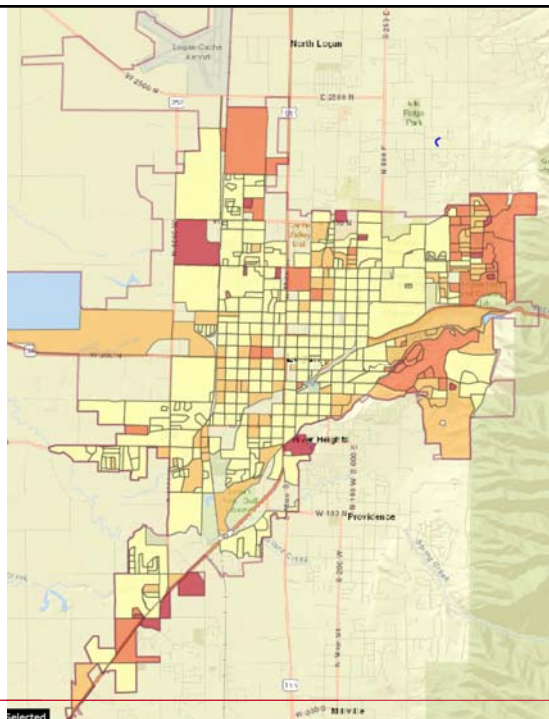

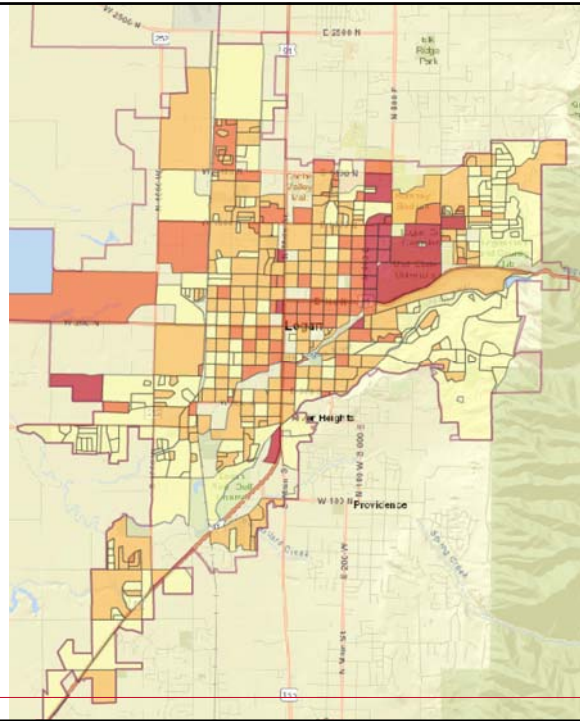
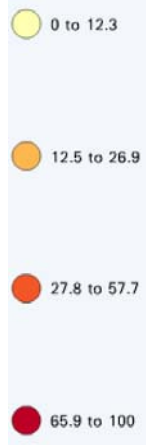

Logan Median Age



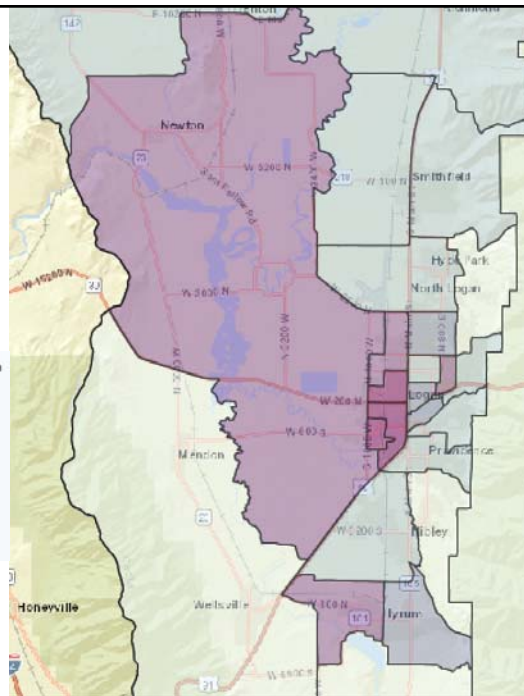
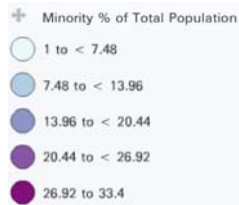

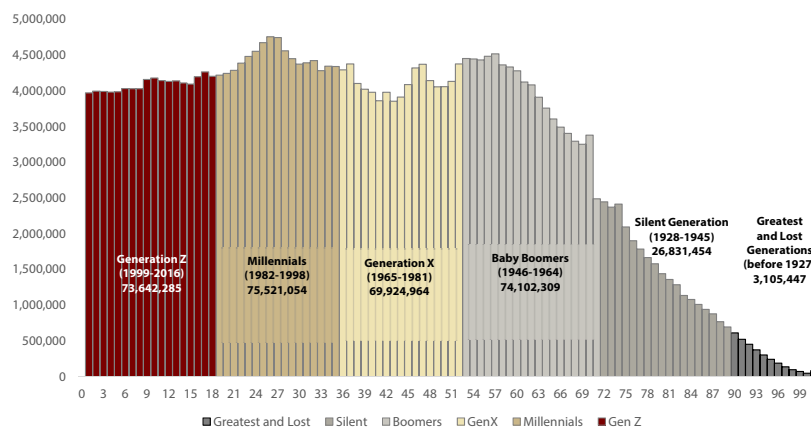
Minorities as a share of the Population



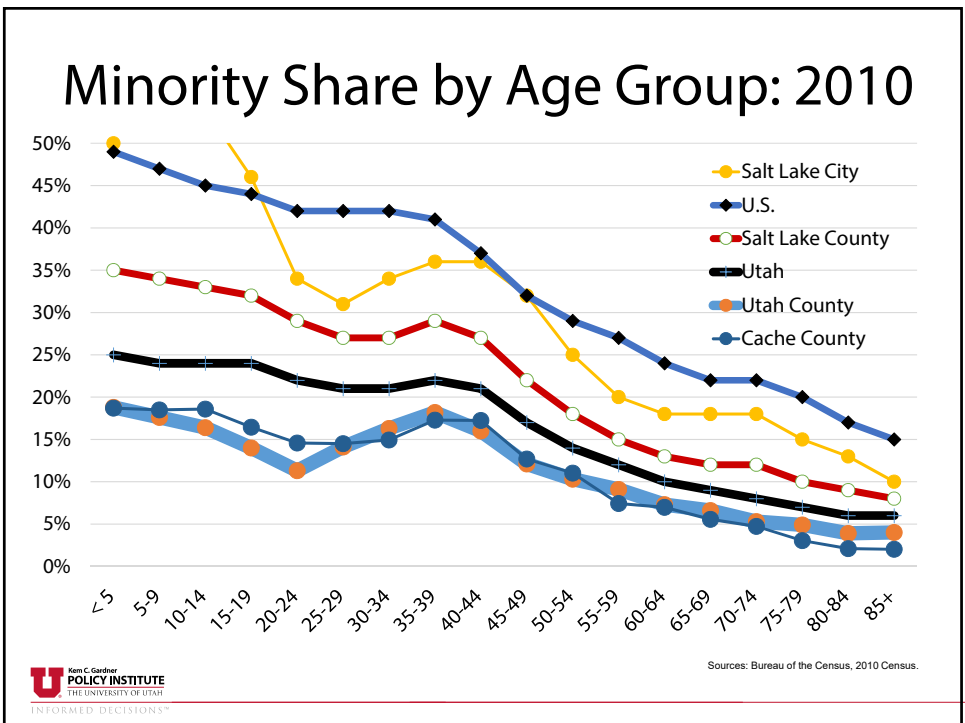
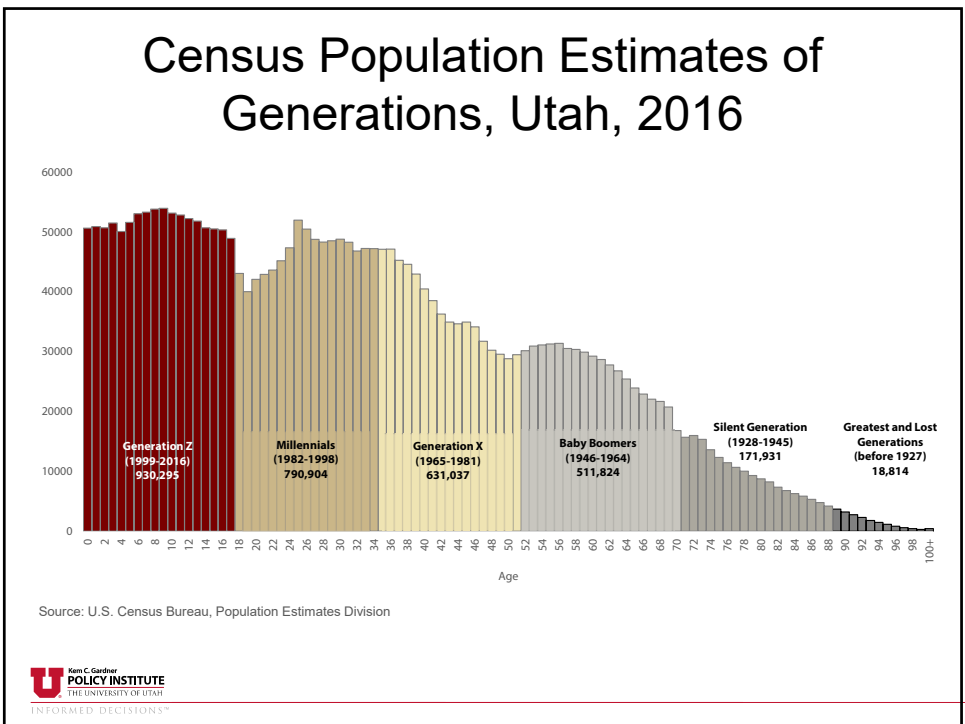

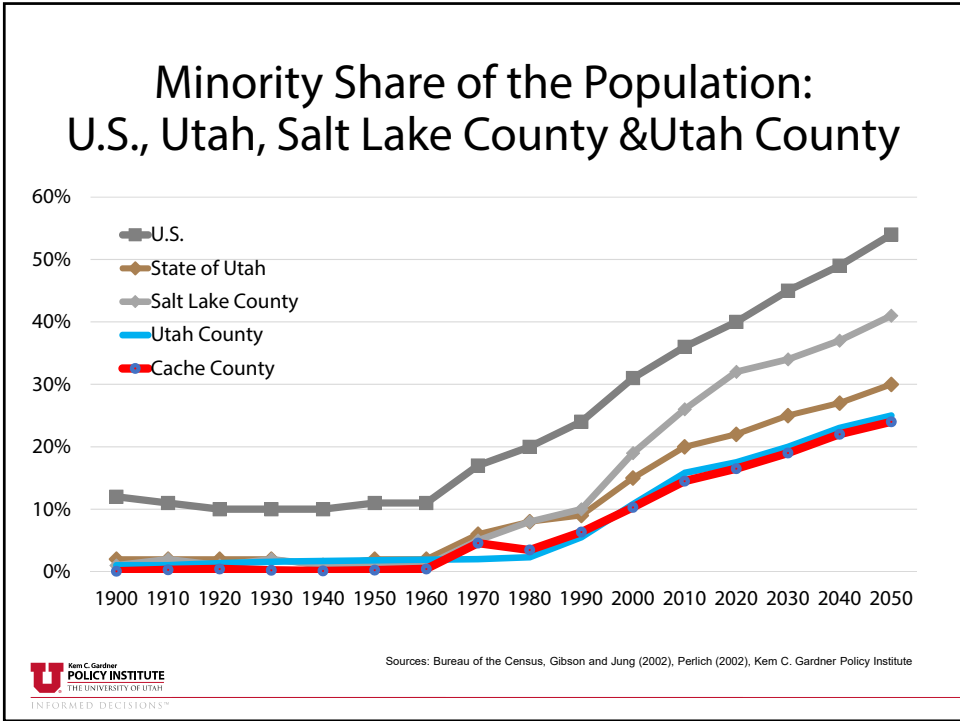
GENERATIONAL SHIFT
